After School Programs - All Sites 2026/2027 Information and FAQ

Hours: After school - 6:00PM

Open on early release days: Early Release - 6:00PM (Extended hours included in tuition)

Open on select holidays and non-school days: Depending on the need (and staffing)

Closed on major federal holidays: Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years, and Memorial Day

Enrollment Options:

- Full-Time (up to 5 days/week): \$610/month
- Part-Time (up to 3 days/week): \$390/month
- Part-Time (up to 2 days/week): \$292/month

* Families are responsible for notifying staff in advance of any schedule changes so they can plan for the appropriate staffing, snacks, and supplies.

Family Membership: Fees for Full-Time Enrollment now include a Household Membership to all branches of the Olympic Peninsula YMCA for the duration of their child’s enrollment in the licensed child care program. That’s a \$96 monthly value, roughly \$1,000 for the school year! Part time enrollment includes discounted rates for family memberships; 50% discount for 3-days/week and 25% discount for 2-days/week.

Structure: A balanced mix of structured time and free play, play-based learning, healthy snacks, hands-on curriculum activities, homework/academic support, and social engagement with children of various ages.

Curriculum: We use SCALED Learning, a YMCA-developed curriculum that provides age-appropriate, skill-building activities in STEM, Career-Connected Learning, Arts, Literacy, Education, and Diversity and Global Learning.

Benefits of a licensed program:

- State oversight - meets state safety and health standards, with regular inspections
- All staff are trained, background-checked, and meet the education and professional development requirements established by DCYF licensing standards.
- Classrooms follow age-appropriate curriculum, structure, and maintain safe child-to-teacher ratios
- We can accept state and military childcare subsidies
- The YMCA assumes responsibility for children while they are in our care. Children must be signed in and out by a parent/guardian or other authorized individual.

Subsidy Information: Washington State is committed to ensuring qualifying families do not pay more than 7% of their income on child care.
